Account of the Griffen Family of Flushing, Long Island, N.Y.

Richard? of Flushing, emigrated from Wales and was one of the first settlers of Long Island. He lived at Flushing and had several children, but it is uncertain how many. The family of John Griffen at Purchase N.Y., and John and Joseph at Amawalk N.Y., were descendants of his.

Richard (?) had 14 children, the oldest Samuel, then Joshua, Jonathan, Edward, Obediah, Joseph, Gilbert, James, Richard, Abraham, Deborah, Sarah, Mary, Miriam.

Samuel and James went east. Samuel left several children. James went to Oxford and was a military man. He married in Boston, but had no children. Jonathan, Edward (3), and Obediah settled in Westchester Co. Jonathan was a military character, and had no children except an adopted son.

Third Generation.

The Griffin records in "American Families of Historic lineage" states that Edward an emigrant from Wales, on Long Is., was 27 yrs. of age in 1697. Previous reference shows that Edward who bought land in 1653 was the imigrant, so the above was probably his grandson and the brother of Samuel. If this is so, Edward who is the fourth son was born 1670, and Samuel the eldest son was born about 1660 or before.

The Huntington Town Records, Vol. 1 says:-

Page 204. In the list of taxpayers for 1675, Samuel Griffin, 1s. 6d.
Page 255. Court charges of Thomas Higbie against Sarah Griffin in Nov. 21, 1681, mentions Samuel Griffin. (was this his first wife?).

He acquired land in Huntington according to the following:-
April 1, 1679.

At a town meeting it was ordered as followeth - That this present smith, Samuel Griffin and all others that shall or may desire land in this town, shall be bound to build & fence their lots given them, and diligently follow their particular trades for the benefit of the town in general and every particular person thereof for the term of seven years at the least, and not make any sale or alienation thereof during the said term of seven years, and the smith shall be bound to place a man of the same trade in his stead in case he see cause to leave the town, or else return it into the town's hands again - they paying to him his full charges, and all such as have lands given them under denomination of hundred or hundreds, shall have land according to what the town shall lay out. but not to what the town have already laid out. above written, it was voted and granted that Samuel Griffin should have a lot in the town upon the forementioned conditions. The forementioned Samuel Griffin doth make choice of a piece of land at the harbour; but he hath changed with Stephen Jarvis jr. for that land lying on the south side of Noah Rogers and now Thos. Weeks, it being about 3 acres. (copied in the revision in the yr 1873, from the original in the old Book No 2, p.45 or 59)

Page 344. Elizabeth Platt ye daughter of Isaack platt of huntington was borne ye 15th Sept., 1665.

" 414. Samuel Griffin and Elizabeth Platt were married ye 14th day of Janeuary, 1685. *this is the other Samuel*

His name appears as witness to deeds occassionally, then no further reference.

Record in Hempstead Census of 1690 states:-

- Samuel Griffin married Elizabeth Platt daughter of Isaac Platt.
- 1673 rated 1s.6d.
- 1679 exchange with Stephen Jarvis of home lot; Samuel Griffin's lot was by the Great Hollow of Gravelin place.
- 1683 rated 18 pounds.

Church records at Hempstead begin in 1725, and in Huntington 1733. The first Griffin record is that of William baptizd in Huntington by Rev. Prime June 6, 1736. It is possible he was the grandson of Samuel. Lands in the vicinity of that of Samuel remained in the family until recent years. To date have been unable to find a will of Samuel.

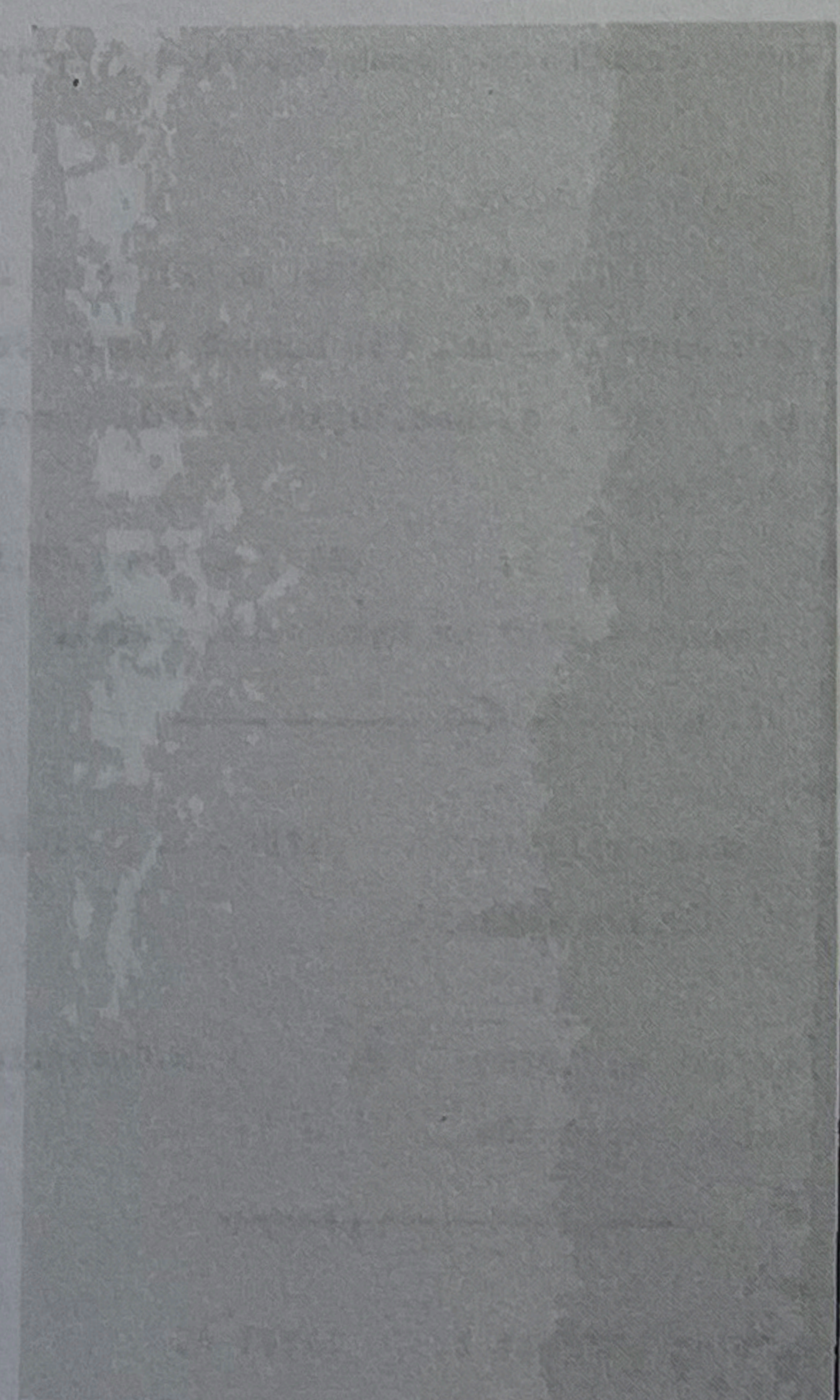

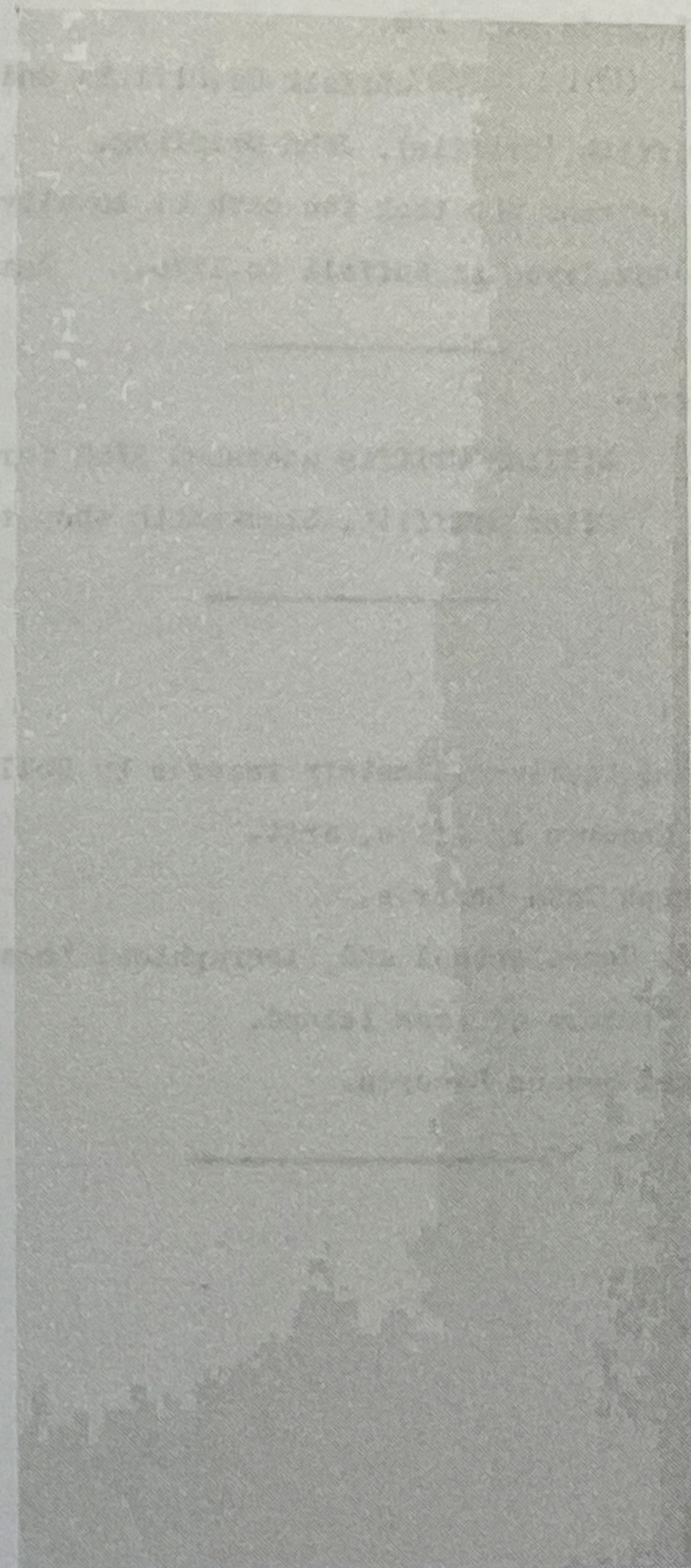

Old Families at Old Fairfield

Hugh Griffin. An earlier man of this name lived at Sudbury, Mass to whom the Stratford settler may have been related. He married Dorothy Skidmore daughter of Thomas. His wife Dorothy died at Stratford and was buried about the last of April 1670. He married 2d. Mary widow of Peter Norton. He died at Stratford Sept. 10, 1691. Hugh Griffin and Dorothy (Skidmore) had:

sons John, Thomas and Samuel; daus. Mary, Dorothy, Hannah, son Francis. John son Hugh b. Stratford Sept. 25 1654 m. Sarah

Children:

Samuel b. Aug. 14, 1698 settled in Newtown, Hugh, John.

* Samuel son Hugh, b. Stratford Feb. 22, 1656/7, died at Derby in 1691, married Elizabeth dau Isaac of Huntington. Inventory in Derby July 14, 1691, gives widow Elizabeth, children Phebe aged 6 and Elizabeth aged 4.

Children:

Phebe b. abt. 1685, married Obadiah Rogers of Huntington
Elizabeth b. abt. 1687 m. Jonathan Wickes of Huntington.

If Samuel son of Hugh is the man assessed at 1s.6d. in 1675, in Huntington, he would be 16 yrs. of age at that time. In 1679 Samuel the blacksmith would be 22 yrs. and possibly had wife Sarah mentioned in the court record of 1681. These could be the ancestors of William whose baptism is recorded in 1736. Samuel died in Derby and may have given his lands to children of the first marriage. There apparently is no record of land transfers.
